Particularly after Lecce bashed the teachers at his latest photo op. Speaking of that photo op, the minister announced how wonderful the government was in listening to parents. He was now allowing them to have their kids opt out of mandatory e-learning...making it optional? Like we already have? He also said that he was "effectively maintaining class sizes for September, somehow failing to recognize that the numbers 22.5 and 23 are not the same numbers. The topic was the development of Election Guidelines for the Unit. These will bring clarity to the election and campaigning processes for candidates at TSU. It will also put the Unit slightly ahead of a number of resolutions that will be coming to the floor of the AGM, March 13-16, regarding election procedures. Looking forward to those coming out soon.

Health & Safety – A large meeting of management and worker co-chairs, from all the Joint Health & Safety Committees in the Board, was held on Wednesday to review the approach to the Coronavirus concerns. You were advised of this by Gillian in an email last Sunday. TSU presented its concerns on behalf of members, including the survey of Reps that the JHSC carried out and Gillian included in that email. The Board is relying on its pandemic protocols of 2006 to guide us, if the issue becomes that significant. In the meantime, as the virus continues its path, whatever that might be, TSU will continue to press the Board in an attempt to get it to do what needs to be done.
